WILLIAM PRICE

(1652 – 1725)

Founder of Price's School
is to take place at

12.00 NOON ON SUNDAY 6TH OCTOBER 2013

The location is the NatWest (RBS) Bank, 52 West Street Fareham, at to the eastern end. This is close to the place where Price's School stood until 1901. From 1908 until its closure Price's School was in Park Lane, Fareham.

For over 250 years the School founded by William Price provided a major contribution to the education of children in Fareham. His bequest is now administered by the William Price Charitable Trust and provides assistance for local education.

The plaque will be unveiled by the Mayor of Fareham, Councillor Susan Bayford, following a short ceremony. The Society welcomes anyone who recognises the contribution of William Price.

More can be learned by visiting the Westbury Manor Museum in West Street, Fareham. It is hoped that educational establishments will be represented by both students and staff.
